times. Boca and Stampede are both below twenty percent capacity, and Tahoe is below the rim, so expect severe low, warm water, conditions later this summer on the Truckee. Now is the time to try your luck. Don't forget the east Walker. It is running at 22 cfs, easy wading, as I write this, and the farmers will have a short irrigation season as Bridgeport Reservoir is at about 12 percent capacity.

Hobart is fishing well, for those of you who hike a little. And Frenchmen's and Davis are about to blossom. Both are quite low, but each can launch a boat. This week, I saw calibaetis, midges and caddis hatching, so the fish are well fed. Fishing was slow however. Damsels are starting to show at Davis, and in about a month, the Hex's will get active. If you haven't tried the Hex hatch, go out a bit before dusk,

and fish nymphs or yellow mayfly dries in size 6 or maybe even #4s! The hatch produces a frenzy of surface feeding, and can be quite fun. West Almanor and Butt Lake also have late June early July Hex hatches.

I recently talked with Angler's Edge, and they recommended some of the higher

this time of year. If you go, let me know how you did. Topaz is reporting 1-2 lb trout along the west (highway) side.

The Gazette-Journal has a pretty comprehensive fishing report each Thursday in their outdoor section, so if you're interested in Wildhorse, Eastern Nevada lakes, or other fisheries, either try that source or the fly shops.

Our Fishout this June is on the 13th at Spooner. As this is a bit of a walk from the parking area, there will be no club BBQ. Bring your own lunch.

Our speaker for the June 9th Meeting will be Jake Kreamer, a local game warden. Come hear about the life and duties of a warden.

If you go be sure to admire the kiosk signs as you approach the water. Two years ago club members refurbished and installed them and they still look pretty good.
