The Southwest Council of the IFFF has posted their volunteer opportunity schedule for the 2015 Silver Creek/Slinkard Creek Lahontan cutthroat project. This is an excellent chance to work with wildlife personnel as they attempt to restore two

small creeks in the Walker River watershed.

Our April fishout is at Pyramid Lake on Saturday the 18th. If you haven't hook into one of those big Pilot Peak fish here's your chance. Don't miss it.

Great turn out for the March Fishout

Once again we had a great turnout for our monthly fishout. Twenty of our club members attended the gathering at Hinkson Slough and were rewarded with good weather, good food and some mighty fine company.

The side dish potluck portion of our barbeque shore side lunch went very well and we will try it again in the future.

Unfortunately while the fishing conditions were great, we were also greeted with some very tough angling results. Looking on the bright side – if we average our February and March numbers, we still had pretty good fishing.

2015 Southwest Council's Lahontan Cutthroat Project

This is the third year of the Southwest Council's Lahontan cutthroat rehabilitation project on Silver Creek above the Marine base on Hwy 89 (near Bridgeport). Fly fishing and conservation groups are working to extend and restore the habitat of the endangered Lahontan cutthroat in their native watershed.

This year the project will focus on two upper Walker tributaries, Silver Creek and Slinkard Creek. Volunteers will assist in electro-fishing to remove the nonnative brook trout from both of the water systems.

A maximum of three volunteers at any one time may work with paid interns, who will work in blocks of eight days at a time. Volunteers may work starting on the Thursday of the block and continue through until Sunday. Typical work duties include netting, measuring and transporting trout, setting up stream nets and the removal of streamside vegetation.

The work dates for Silver Creek are below:

June 25 through 28 July 9 through 12 July 23 through 26 Aug 6 through 9 Aug 20 through 23 Sept. 3 through 6

The work dates for Slinkard Creek are the middle four blocks of time.

Volunteers of the project are also issued special fishing permits for Silver Creek as this small body of water has now been closed to all fishing since 1994. As a plus the Lahontan Cutthroats landed and photographed in this native watershed qualify for the California Heritage Trout Challenge.

Rob Brehm and Bill Hammons worked on the Silver Creek portion of this project two years ago and should be able to answer any questions you might have.

State Fly Tying Contest

The Nevada Fair will be held in Carson City on July30th through August 2nd. Our club will again host a Nevada State Fly Tying Contest and the award winning flies will be displayed in a case at the fly fishing booth.

The contest ran very smoothly last year and we plan to follow the same format with very few changes. If you have any ideas that you believe would make this event better, please contact any board member so that it may be considered.

Three divisions are being offered to participants (advanced, intermediate and youth) with twenty fly categories. The categories have mandatory flies and some have additional requirements.

A three person panel consisting of a member from each of the three northern Nevada clubs will determine the winning entries. All flies and funds in excess of contest associated costs will be donated to the Nevada division of Reel Recovery.

Awards will be mailed to all winning tiers immediately after fair conclusion.
