
Looking forward to seeing you at the meeting on the 12^{th} , and the banquet on the 23^{rd} .

10 Spot Challenge Reminder

Time is winding down for members to complete the club's 2019

10 Spot Challenge.

The challenge is for members to fish ten different waters during the year. The waters are not limited to Nevada, as any state is eligible. It is not necessary to be successful at each water, simply make the effort.

Currently we know of nine members who have completed the challenge and have fished in at least ten waters. We're also aware of several members who are just a couple of waters shy of the goal.

For those needing a few more waters, here is a list of nearby streams and stillwaters that can be utilized to finish the challenge. All of these are within 30 minutes of downtown Carson City. You can fish ten of these "local" waters, and still qualify for a certificate. There's still a week left to complete the challenge, so call in sick ("my arm is in a cast"), get out and soak up this beautiful fall weather, and wet a line!
